

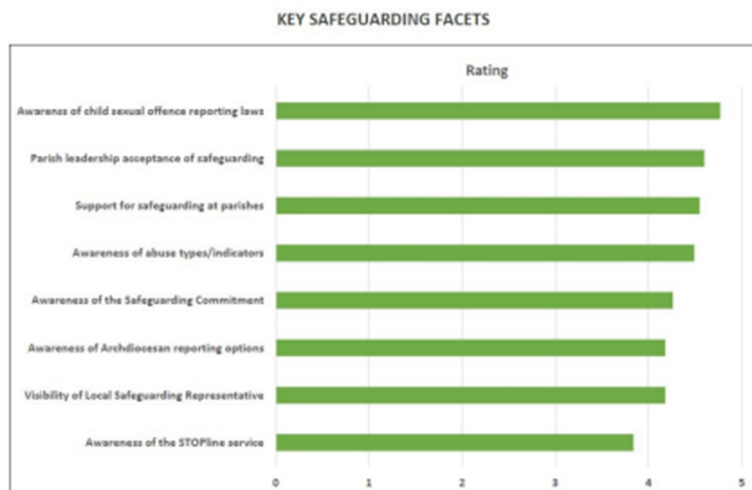
Archdiocese of Brisbane's Parish Safeguarding Survey & Child Safeguarding Survey

Parish Safeguarding Survey. This survey sought feedback from parishes communities about key elements of the Archdiocesan approach to safeguarding. 597 responses were received.

On a rating scale of 1-5 (5 being strongly agree), respondents on average rated current safeguarding practices as highly effective at

managing risks and creating safer environments at their parish (average rating of 4+).

The following graph shows the overall average response to questions (on a rating of 1-5) about key safeguarding facets.

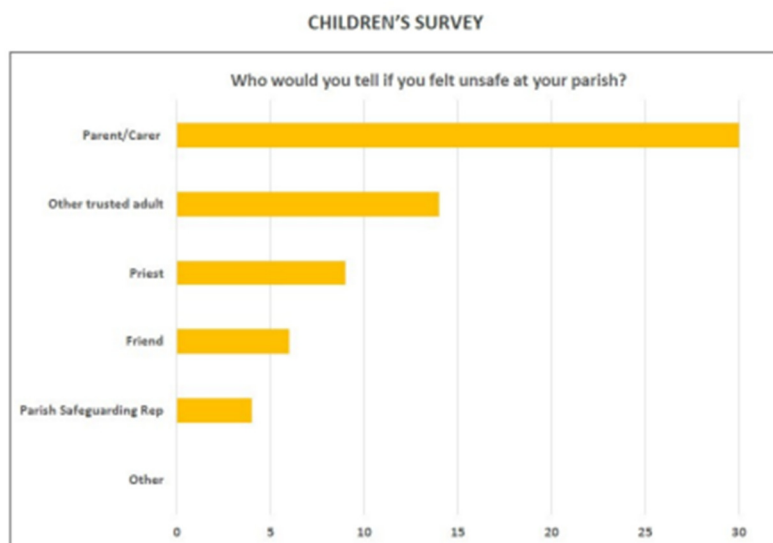


Child Safeguarding Survey. This survey sought feedback from children 12 years of age and under about their perceptions of safety at their parish and their knowledge of key safeguarding measures. 31 responses were received.

On a rating scale of 1 to 5 (5 being strongly agree), 30 of the 31 children said that they feel safe at their parish, and that they had never felt unsafe at their parish.

22 of the children said that they would tell someone if they felt unsafe at the parish and 9 were unsure.

The following graph shows who the children are most likely to tell if they feel unsafe at their parish.



18 of the children said they had not been told about measures to keep them safe at their parish and 13 said they had.

24 of the children said they did not know who their Local Safeguarding Representative was and 7 said they did.

They will be important in shaping the Archdiocesan approach to safeguarding next year.
