Christmas Continues

"It matters not what someone is born, but what they grow to be". These words which J.K. Rowling put on the lips of Dumbledore in "Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire" are very relevant as we celebrate Christmas. For Christmas is not just about the birth of a child and who he is, but about what this child will become. That is why the final feast of the Christmas Season is not the Epiphany (the visit of the Magi), but rather the Baptism of Jesus. For it is in the Baptism of Jesus that he discovers not just who he is, but also what is his mission - "You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased".

Not only don't we acknowledge that, but we even tend to compress the Christmas story as if it about a week in the life of Mary and Joseph! So, when it comes to the Story of the Magi, most people presume they turned up while Joseph was packing up the stable, having filled out the census forms and loaded the donkey for the trip home to Nazareth which would incorporate a short diversion into Jerusalem to have the kid circumcised!

But, in fact, Jesus would probably have been going on to the age of two before the Magi appeared on the scene. At least that is the implication, for we are told that Herod ordered the massacre of every child under the age of two in an attempt to eliminate the threat he saw in Jesus, "reckoning on the date he had been careful to ask the Magi" (Matthew 2/16), that is the exact date the star had first appeared (Matthew 2/7). So it could have been a long-term rental that Mary and Joseph had to find in Bethlehem!

But we need to remember that the Christmas Season is not just about the timing of events surrounding the birth of Jesus, but about the significance of the child. So the story of the circumcision of Jesus (Luke 2/21) is celebrated within the Christmas Season on the eighth day (Leviticus 12/3) which is New Year's day, while the Feast of the Purification and Presentation in the Temple (Luke 2/22ff) is celebrated on February 2nd, outside the Christmas Season but forty days after we celebrated his birth (Leviticus 12/3f).

A number of years ago, it was decided not to celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany on its traditional date of January 6th (12 days after Christmas), but on the nearest Sunday to that date. Sadly, this year, that decision means that the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is pushed out of its rightful place as the final Sunday feast of Christmas and relegates it to the following Monday. Now, without denying the significant statement of the Feast of Epiphany that Christ is saviour of all nations, I dare to suggest that perhaps the most telling event in Jesus' life which turned his life around and which is recorded in every one of the Gospels, is more significant and worthy of celebration than a possible fable found in only one Gospel, no matter how significant the message is.

So, in order to do justice to both, I have decided to celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on the following Sunday, which is designated the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. To that end, Readers might like to note that we will not be using the Readings you will find in your "Break Open the Word" for the weekend of January 14th/15th, but rather the Readings for Year A's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord - Isaiah 42/1-2, 6-7; Psalm 28; Acts 10/34-38 and Matthew 3/13-17. There are copies of the Readings at the back of the Church if you would like to take one home with you to familiarize yourself with it prior to the Feast.

Then on the following weekend of 21st/22nd January, we will revert to the original calendar and celebrate the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time with the normal readings for that day.

In the meantime, let's continue our celebration of Christmas, recognizing that it is not just who we are born, but what we grow to be!


