A Legend of the Flowers

After Baiame, the god of creation, had left the earth and gone to his sacred Oobi Oobi mountain, the flowers he had left behind withered and died, and nothing grew in their place. The earth was bare and desolate and soon flowers became merely a legend which the old people passed on to the young ones.

When the flowers went, so too did the bees. The women would take out their bark dishes to fill with honey but they always returned with them empty. There were bees still living and working on earth but only in three sacred trees which Baiame had claimed as his own and the people did not dare go near these. The children cried because they wanted honey, and the mothers were upset because they could not give it to them, for the wise old men of the tribes would not let them touch Baiame's sacred trees.

The spirit who saw everything told Baiame how the people longed for honey and yet would not touch his trees, and Baiame was pleased. He decided to give them food as sweet as the honey which they loved. Soon white sugary specks appeared on the gum leaves and sweet juice began running down the tree trunks and hardening into lumps which the children could gather. The people were happy and their craving for rich food was satisfied.

But the wise old men were far from satisfied. They longed to see the flowers growing again, and so determined were they that, without telling the people of their tribes where they were going, they set out to find Baiame to ask him to make the earth beautiful with flowers once more.

They journeyed on for many days until at last they came to the foot of the sacred Oobi Oobi mountain, towering so far above them that its top was lost in the clouds. At first the sides seemed too steep to climb but eventually they found a foothold, and then another, and then another until, looking up, they saw a ladder cut into the mountain reaching as far as they could see. Up they went climbing one day, two days, three days until, at last, on the fourth day, they reached the top, completely exhausted.

They looked around and saw a spring of water from which they drank eagerly and at once their weariness left them. Suddenly, they heard the sound of a bull-roarer or spirit asking them why they had come.

They told him how dreary the earth had looked since Baiame had left, how the flowers had all died and had not bloomed again and, although they had the sweet tree juice in place of honey, they longed for the flowers to make the earth bright once more.

The spirit ordered his attendants to lift the wise old men up into their sky-camp, which is a resting place in the sky where flowers neither fade nor die. Here they could gather as many as they could hold in their arms and the spirits would lift them back onto the top of the mountain so that they could return to earth. Just as the spirit had said, the wise old men were lifted up through an opening in the sky and set down in a land of exquisite beauty with flowers blooming everywhere, massed together in brilliant colours like hundreds of rainbows laid out on the grass. The old men were so overcome that they wept with joy. But they soon remembered why they were there and they gathered as many of the lovely blooms as their arms could hold. And they heard the spirit voice saying, "Tell the people that the earth will never be without flowers again. Different winds will bring them in every season, and the east wind will bring them in profusion and there will be blossoms on every tree and shrub.

The wise old men took the flowers and went down the stone ladder to the camps of their people. The people flocked around them and they told of the promise made by Baiame, through his messenger. And the people scattered the flowers far and wide, over the tree-tops and over the plains and ridges and, wherever they fell, they have grown ever since. The place they were first scattered is called Girraween, the place of flowers, and the earth was covered with cool grass and flowers as when Baiame, god of creation, walked on it.




