Laudato Si' Week 2023 marks eighth anniversary of Pope Francis' landmark encyclical Laudato Si' on caring for Creation. In Australia, we will celebrate Laudato Si' Week 16—24 May. Dates are different from the dates promoted internationally to enable us to fully celebrate National Sorry Day (May 26) and National Reconciliation Week (May 27 – June 3) fully. The theme for 2023 is Hope for the Earth, Hope for Humanity.

ST IGNATIUS PEACE THROUGH JUSTICE GROUP would like to celebrate Laudato Si' by inaugurating a reading and video group on aboriginal ways and spirituality which combines ecological sustainability and spirituality. The first meeting to be held on Wednesday 17 May at 7pm in the Horstmann Room where we will show relevant videos whilst suppling hot soup and will then discuss possible reading resources for on-going meetings.

Also, our group will hold a fundraising stall of home-baked goods and craft items next **Sunday 21 May** following both 8.30am (Holy Spirit) and 5pm (St Ignatius) Masses (funds raised will go to current famine-stricken areas of the world as a response to the "Cry of The Poor" from Laudato Si. Contributions of baked items would be warmly welcomed.

Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Priority Five: Engaging Anew with First Nations Peoples

The injustice done to First Nations peoples in this country is a running sore at the heart of the nation. It is contemporary Australia's original sin... We need a genuinely new engagement of the Church with the First Nations peoples, especially in an Archdiocese like this where the Indigenous presence is strong. A new engagement will mean, first of all, listening to Indigenous voices, and believing that we can learn if we really listen. In the past, non-Indigenous Australia has struggled to believe that we could learn anything from First Nations peoples. They could learn from us, but not we from them. That has to change, both in the Church and in Australia more generally. Then the listening and learning need to lead to action.

Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Priority Six: Implementing Integral Ecology

Natural and human ecology interact in mysterious and unmistakable ways. To interfere with one is to interfere with the other; to promote the good of one is to promote the good of the other. Fratelli Tutti (a recent Papal Encyclical) focuses more upon human ecology in speaking of the radical interconnectedness of all human beings at a moment when alienation and polarisation are making disconnectedness seem the norm. The Church is called in such a moment to be a sign of contradiction, speaking in a way that rises above politics and economics so that a genuinely biblical and Christian voice can be heard.
