# **Towards A Self-Reliant Community**

The model of a "Community of Communities" is dependent on each community being able to stand on its own two feet. Otherwise, there is the danger that one community will swamp the others because of its strength or that one


community will drain the others of their resources because of its neediness. But there is no reason why four well-established communities, with their varied resources, cannot enrich each other and grow stronger through the move towards greater union.

So, to prepare ourselves best for this challenge, we can strengthen the bonds of our own community and move towards making it even more self-reliant than it already is. For the less reliant we are on having clergy or people outside the community to perform or structure ministry in the area, the more efficient and trustworthy is that ministry. The idea of that is not to get a jump on the other communities or to take on the role of being big brother among the communities, but rather to make sure our structures are as good as they can be in order to support the move to transition which enhances the various communities, rather than be a threat to them.

Already we have a fairly strong and self-reliant community. It was forged during the time the Jesuits had responsibility for the community. Even though there was always a number of Jesuit priests in the area, their broader commitments and not knowing who was liable to turn up for which ceremony meant that much of the organization had to be done by parishioners or Office Staff. Just to mention a couple: Clare Watts at Auchenflower and Percy Hanlon at Toowong almost hold legendary status for the organization they brought to each of those communities. But they couldn't have done it alone and the myriad of others who supported them made it all possible. That has not changed during my time and, in fact, the need has become even greater with a decline in the number of Office Staff. So, we are grateful for the multitude of volunteers in our communities for the gifts they bring to the various existing ministries and for the responsibilities they have taken on.

So, to refresh the process, we are going to invite people to take responsibility for various elements of our ministry, either in house or to the broader community. The idea is not to laden people with enormous responsibility, but rather to create teams in each of the areas so that we can develop support for each other and a natural process of sharing the load and handing on the responsibility as is needed. As is now the case, some may take on responsibilities across the communities, while others may just take responsibility within their own community.

Then rather than brace ourselves for change, we may be able to embrace it and run with it.

50 year Anniversary of First National Aboriginal Liturgy in Australia. 2023 marks 50 years since a significant event took place at the Melbourne Myer Music Bowl. The occasion was part of the 40th International Eucharistic Congress and was titled the Australian Aboriginal Liturgy. More than 150 adults, teenagers, and a children's choir, mainly from the Kimberley region of Western Australia and the Northern Territory, participated in the event. It was the first time many people witnessed Aboriginal people expressing their Catholic faith in culturally significant ways, and it was the first public and National Aboriginal Liturgy in Australia.
