PARABLES OF THE KINGDOM

Over the month of July, the Sunday Gospels focus on Matthew's parables of the Kingdom, which are found in Chapter 13 of his Gospel. Matthew has a tendency to group the sayings of Jesus together according to theme, layering them between sections of narrative, like a sandwich! The most famous of these groupings is the so-called Sermon on the mount which runs through 3 chapters near the beginning of the Gospel (cc 5-7). In chapter 13, we are introduced to the parable of the Sower (w. 4-23), the parable of the Weeds (w. 24-30, 36-43), the Mustard Seed (w. 31f), the Yeast (w. 33), and the parables of the Treasure Hidden in the Field (w. 44), the Pearl of Great Price (w. 45f), and of the Fishing Net (w. 47-50). While these are all parables of the Kingdom, it by no means exhausts Matthew's use of the phrase, but does account for 12 of the 55 uses of the term "kingdom" in Matthew's Gospel.

Of course, the term "Kingdom" itself was a controversial one, even (or maybe 'especially') at the time of Jesus. So, even in the Gospels that use the term somewhat prolifically, we see Jesus try to distance himself from any political (subversive?) understanding of the word. So, when his disciples (and Peter in particular) give him the title 'Christ' or 'Messiah', his tendency is to balance the glory connotations with a corrective emphasis on the need for him to suffer. Whether this is an accurate reflection of Jesus' own attitude or is a result of the Gospel writers trying to defuse the explosive implications of the use of the term in their own time is debatable, but we do know that one of the four major charges brought against early Christians as late as the second century was the charge of Treason, because they proclaimed a kingdom different from the Roman Empire. And, of course, we have the famous attempt by Nero to put the blame on the Christian community for the fire that all but destroyed Rome, on the grounds that they were trying to advance the coming of the kingdom by orchestrating the sort of disasters that they predicted would accompany the end of time (Mark c.13).

This may go a long way to explaining why, even though the earlier Gospels are far from reticent in using the term, with Luke using it 44 times compared with Matthew's 55, and Mark, the earliest, a more modest 20 times, while the last of the Gospels, that of John, uses the term only 5 times and three of those are in conversation with Pilate in which he tries to convince the Roman that the Kingdom has nothing to do with this world (John 18/33-40).

So what is the Kingdom? And how do you tell when it will come? There seems to be little doubt that for the early Christian community, it meant the end of the world as we know it, and that it would happen in their own life time. In that famous chapter in Mark's Gospel where he talks of all the upheaval that will accompany the end times, Jesus warns them that "this generation will not pass away until all this had happened. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away" (Mark c.13/30f). Earlier in the Gospel, after talking about his coming I the glory of the Father accompanied by the angels, Mark has Jesus say, "Truly, I tell you, there are some standing here who will not die before seeing the Kingdom of God coming with power" (Mark 9/1).


Calling on all past students of St Ignatius Catholic Primary School Toowong.
