120 Years of Catholic Education In This Area

Holy Spirit Church Harriett Street, Auchenflower

(excerpts from material compiled by Percy & Judy Hanlon as a Jubilee Year 2000 Project)

A private school, built by Mrs. G.W. Williams, was set up in 1875 near the Railway Station with 85 pupils enrolled. A State School, catering for 350 students, was opened on 22nd January, 1888, with 75 pupils building up to 150 pupils by the end of the year. By 1888, the population in Toowong was estimated at 2,230 in 446 dwellings. Apart from a School of Arts in Sherwood Road and an Oddfellows Hall in Church (Jephson) Street, private schools were also in existence in Church Street (Miss Clark) and Sherwood Road (Miss Abe).

"The Age" on Saturday September 13, 1902, reported that "the Sisters of Mercy have secured a new Convent building in Toowong (the property known as "Goldicott") and a movement is now on foot to erect a school for them. This movement, which no doubt will be successful, is especially in bad times like the present, a strong argument for the sincerity of Catholic parents in religious education. "Goldicott", on a hill above Kensington Terrace, was previously the home of Charles Lambert Depree, a Railway Engineer, and was built in 1866 or so. Charles died in 1893 when the property passed to his widow from whom the Sisters of Mercy purchased the property." The Sisters of Mercy renamed the property "Mount St Mary's Convent, Toowong.

The "Brisbane Courier" on Monday September 22nd, 1902, reported that a meeting was held after the 9.30am Mass the day before at Toowong to consider the erecting of a convent school in connection with the Church. A packed church heard Archbishop Dunne, who had assisted and preached at the Mass, explain that the recent purchase of Goldicott by the Sisters of Mercy offered an excellent opportunity for starting a school under their management, with the distance from any other Catholic school seemingly making it imperative to avail themselves of the chance that now presented itself. The meeting agreed and work was undertaken without delay, to enable the school to be opened at the beginning of the coming scholastic year.

"The Age" on Saturday November 8th, 1902, recorded the Blessing of the Foundation Block of the new school. "On Sunday afternoon last, His Grace Archbishop Dunne, assisted by the Rev. Wm Lee, blessed the foundation block of a new school to be erected in connection with Holy Souls' Church, Toowong. After His Grace had blessed the block according to the Ritual, he said he was very glad to find himself among them for the purpose of blessing the future school. He believed, and he felt quite sure they believed with him, that there could be nothing better for them than having in their midst a good school for their children.

Many years ago, when stationed in another part of the State, he had advocated to the people the benefit of getting homes and farms for themselves and, instead of preaching sermons, had been wont to read the Government proclamations showing where land could be got. Some had said it would be better to preach the Gospel, but he had seen the advantage of inducing people to make homes for themselves. Parents had a sacred charge from the Almighty in their children. He had travelled over most of the world and had never seen brighter children than in Australia. He said that everywhere, and he believed the children understood it.

A little time ago in Brisbane, a good mother was preparing some dinner for her children to take with them to school. Instead of the usual bread and butter, she had put up some cake for them. While cutting the cake, she remarked: "This cake is too good for you youngsters". The little girl of nine years replied, "Mother, the Archbishop says nothing on earth is too good for an Australian child". This is the truth. They could not do too much for them in the way of schools. He thought the whole country was of that impression. He then enjoined them to cherish the school as their own. "Cuddle it to your hearts", he said. "Make it the apple of your eye. There is nothing in the world that will reward you as well.".

"The Age" on Saturday January 24th, 1903, recorded that "the Convent School which has been in the course of erection for some time past at Toowong is now completed, and the ceremony of blessing and opening took place on last Sunday afternoon, 18th January, 1903, with the Archbishop and Father Lee officiating."
