(Excerpts from Archbishop Mark Coleridge's Sermon for this weekend)

enflower The readings this weekend are all about extending a welcome to outsiders. It begins with Isaiah's challenge to welcome non-Jews as fellows in prayer, finds expression in Paul's pride to be seen as an apostle to the pagans, and finds its culmination in Jesus' recognition of the faith of the Indigenous Canaanite woman in asking for a peaceful spirit for her daughter.

This same outreach is at the heart of the Annual Catholic Campaign. The campaign is one very concrete sign of the mercy of God at work, entering the world of wrong relationship and setting it aright, breaking down the tribal walls, the walls of 'us and them', and building bridges that all people, but especially those most in need, can take their place in the house of God.

It's our faith which opens a door in the lives of people in need and, through that door, in mysterious and even hidden ways, comes the healing power of the Risen Lord, for whom there is no wound that cannot be healed, no torment that cannot be calmed.

In the Annual Catholic Campaign, we bring our needs to Jesus:

The first is Holy Spirit Seminary which trains our ordained leaders of the future who are as important as they ever were, even if the numbers aren't what they used to be. These men need to be formed, in a special way, the ministers of Christ's mercy; and the Campaign makes that possible.

Then there is the Priests' Foundation which helps support our retired and sick priests who have dedicated their lives to meeting human need with the merciful love of God. As their number grows greater, so too does the need to boost the Foundation which makes care for them possible. Our generosity has to match not just their number but their need.

A third need we bring to the Lord is the Mary MacKillop Catholic School Access Fund, which helps provide bursaries for students whose families are facing financial hardship and, at times, even homelessness. The Fund ensures that these students have access to a quality Catholic education through our Brisbane Catholic Education schools

There are also Centacare's Pastoral Ministries which provide support to families in distress and to victims of domestic violence, to those suffering mental illness and those in prison, to hospital chaplaincy and to the disabled. Much of this work is hidden, but these ministries are one of the most important outreaches of the Church to people in need.

Finally, there is the Annual Grants Program which provides start-up support to creative grassroots ministries in the parishes and wider Catholic community. Each year, grants are made to a wide range of initiatives in areas as diverse as service of the poor, youth ministries, faith education and the teaching of prayer. The grants are not large but the fruits of these works are.

Your donation, whatever it may be, allows the Lord's mercy to flow through the Church into the lives of needy human beings. The face of the Church can seem ordinary enough, as can the face of each of us. But, if we open the door of faith and allow God's mercy to flow through us into the lives of those in need, then people will see in the Church and in each of us, the face of Christ himself. That's what the Annual Catholic Campaign is about.

St Ignatius Parish Sacramental Preparation Programme - Sacrament of Confirmation




Parishioners are asked to pray for these children (& their families) during this time as they continue their preparation to receive Sacrament of Confirmation

SAFEGUARDING NEWS: Archdiocese of Brisbane has released a revised Volunteers Matrix. 'Standard & Matrix - Volunteer Safeguarding Accreditation Requirements".

Further to information provided in last weekend's parish newsletter.

Please note following additional information received in an email from Archdiocese of Brisbane Safeguarding office:

"Other communications that have recently been issued under the hand of the Vicar General made it clear that 'mass participation' roles such as Readers and Communion Ministers at mass are not required to register as a volunteer and do not have any safeguarding accreditation requirements. This is because they are considered low risk, particularly as they generally perform those functions on an infrequent or ad hoc basis, publicly during mass in front of the Parish Priest and congregation, and for only a brief period of time during the mass. Also, they are not working or engaging directly with children or vulnerable adults during those roles in such a way that provides an opportunity for abuse.

However, should a person fulfill both a mass participation role and a volunteer role identified on the revised Matrix they will need to formally register as a volunteer and satisfy the accreditation requirements for that role.

Generally, individuals who do not undertake any of the roles on the Matrix are not considered volunteers and cannot be appointed or registered as a volunteer.

Important – there is no longer any general/ad hoc volunteer category. Parishes cannot and must not seek to register any person under this category. Also, there should not be any 'stand in' roles.

As set out in the Standard that accompanies the Matrix, the Matrix does not provide an exhaustive list of all possible volunteer roles within a parish, ministry or service but it does list the most recognised roles.

Where a parish has another volunteer role (i.e. not listed on the Matrix) which involves working with children and/or adults-at-risk (a medium or high responsibility/risk role), the parish is expected to conduct an assessment of that role to determine appropriate safeguarding accreditation requirements. The Safeguarding Office and People & Culture Office should be consulted in that assessment.

Where a parish does have such a role, the incumbent will need to be formally registered as a volunteer In conducting an assessment of a role not listed on the Matrix, the primary consideration in determining volunteer safeguarding accreditation requirements must be the safety, protection and well-being of children and adults-at-risk.'
