Philosopher vs Priest

(I thought you might be interested in the rest of the Ordination Sermon given by a Jesuit Bishop that we started last week.)

Now I believe that Jesus was a profoundly weaker man than Socrates. Socrates never wept over Athens; Socrates never expressed sorrow and pain at the betrayal of friends. He was possessed and integral, never over-extended, convinced that the just man could never suffer genuine hurt. And, for this reason, Socrates - one of the greatest men who have ever existed, a paradigm of what humanity can achieve within the individual - was a philosopher. And, for these same reasons, Jesus of Nazareth was a priest - ambiguous, suffering, mysterious and salvific.

So also us, my friends, so also us. The Christian must be liable to suffering, weak as any human because we must be like what we touch - the body of Christ. Obviously, we understand ourselves primarily and imaginatively through the Eucharist within the Church. And what is the Eucharist? The Body of Christ, certainly; but how understood? Psychologists tells us that human persons understand themselves in terms of their spontaneous body-image; what we feel about our body and its worth is what we feel about ourselves.

And how did Christ understand this, His body? A body which was broken for us, a blood that was shed for us: a sacrificed self, effective only through its destruction. What is more: in our ritual, the Eucharist only achieves its graced entrance into our lives if broken and distributed to others. This is the liability of Christ to suffering - his ability to be broken and shed - that makes both His priesthood effective and His Eucharist possible. How paradoxical this mystery is: the strength of our Christianity lies precisely in and through the weakness of our humanity.

Why? For two reasons, I think. Weakness relates us profoundly with others; it allows us to feel with them the human condition, the human struggle and darkness and anguish which calls out for salvation. Further, weakness relates us profoundly and apostolically with God, because it provides the arena in which God's power is made manifest in weakness. And so, St Paul:

"I will all the more gladly glory in my weakness, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weakness, insults, hardships, persecution and calamities.

For, when I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Corinthians 12/9-10)

There is a collective consequence which follows from all this. Our communities must make such a life possible: we must support one another in weakness, forgiving one another daily faults and carrying one another's burdens. It is absurd to maintain weakness as part of the essential Christian vocation and then to belittle those who are deficient, or to resent those who are insensitive and clumsy, or to allow disagreements to become hostilities, or to continue battles and angers because of personal feelings.

The commandment and judgement upon our lives is that we should love one another as He has loved us; as He cared - out of His weakness - for our weakness, and so became our Eucharist. This is the foundation of our lives together, the deep mystery of our mutual priestly presence, so let us always be reconciled with one another. May God grace you in the Christian lives that you live: "For Christ is not weak in dealing with you, but is powerful in you. For He was crucified in weakness, but lives in the power of God. For we are weak in Him but, in dealing with you, we shall live with Him, by the power of God." (2 Corinthians 13/3-4).

Synod 2021 synodal Church

For the Synod

We pray for the Church, that she may adopt listening and dialogue as a lifestyle at every level, and allow herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit towards the peripheries of the world.

Extract from writing by Fr Andrew Hamilton sj. Continued from last weekend—

.. This spirit is also embedded in his dream for the Synod. The effectiveness of the Synod will not lie in the quality of the speeches that are made, the majorities that are won on significant votes, nor in the changes to Church structures that are agreed upon. It will lie in the quality of the interchange between people at every level that is generated by the Synod. It is about commending a way of living and relating among Catholics that will be practiced at the Synod. The Synod will then be an attractive model for the whole Church in all its relationships at parish, diocesan and national levels.

The heart of fruitful interchange and of our opening ourselves to the Spirit lies in the quality of our listening. In listening we quieten and relax ourselves and open ourselves to others, whereas when speaking we tighten ourselves and shut out other sounds as distractions. In a parliamentary process we speak to win a vote for the position we have taken. In the Synod we listen and exchange views in order to win one another to attend to the voice of the Spirit. We trust in God and not in our own convictions and arguments.

In his Intention Pope Francis refers to this process as a life-style. It is more than an organisational procedure. It is a way of living as Church. The way in which people are invited to work at the Synod is way of life relating at every level of the Church, beginning from the small groups in a parish and reaching to the Cardinals in Rome. It is built around prayer – not only in the saying of prayers before each day's proceedings, but more important in the personal discernment and listening at each exchange in the Synod in which the participants ask where the Spirit is leading them. Ideally this way of working will be reflected in the life of parishes, the ways in which they relate to the Bishop in the diocese, Bishops relate to one another in the nation, and the national Church relates to the International Church centred in Rome.

Pope Francis also prays for the fruits of the Synod. They will be found in the ways in which at each level of the Church we are not preoccupied with the internal order of the Church but with reaching out to its edges. There are to be found the people to whom the Spirit draws us. There, too, is the place where we find our inner life as Church renewed.



An invitation to all members of our past pupil community, especially those celebrating a milestone reunion year (your graduation class ends in a '3) - Saturday 4 November.


