Are You Weak Enough to be a Christian?

(The following is an excerpt from and Ordination Sermon given by a Jesuit Bishop that I came across many years ago. It was addressing the question of Priesthood but, since I believe it has wider ramifications for all Christians, And we all share the priesthood of Christ, I have changed the word 'priest' to 'Christian'.

There is a further pressing question, one proper to Christianity, if not uniquely proper to it: Is this person weak enough to be a Christian? Let me spell out what I mean. Is this person deficient enough so that they can ward off significant suffering from their life, so that they feel what it is to be an average person? Because it is in this deficiency, in this interior lack, in this weakness, maintains the Letter to the Hebrews, that the efficacy of the ministry and priesthood of Christ lies.

"For, because He Himself (Christ) has suffered and been tempted. He is able to help those who are tempted ... For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize with our weakness, But one who has, in every respect, been tempted as we are, but without sinning. So He can deal gently with the ignorant and the wayward, since He Himself is beset with weakness.'

How terribly important for us Christians to enter into the seriousness of this revelation, of this conjunction between the call to Christianity and weakness, that we dwell upon 'deficiency' as part of our vocation! Otherwise, we can secularize our lives into an amalgam of desires and talents and we can feel weakness as a threat to our Christianity, as indicative that we have never been genuinely Christian, that we do not have the resources to complete what we once thought was our destiny, and which spoke of our generosity and fidelity.

What do I mean by 'weakness'? Not the experience of sin (though it may contextualize sin) but the experience of a peculiar liability to suffering; a profound sense of inability, both to do and to protect: an inability, even after great effort, to author, perform, effect what we have wanted, or achieve the success we want; an inability to secure one's own future, to protect oneself, to live with clarity and assurance, to ward off shame and suffering.

If one is clever enough, or devious enough, or poised enough, we can limit our horizon and expectations. and accomplish pretty much whatever we want. We can secure our perimeters and live without a sense of failure, or inadequacy, or shame, before what might have been. But if you cannot do that - either because of your history, or your temperament, or your situation - then you experience weakness at the heart of your life. And this experience, rather than mitigate against your Christian calling, is part of its essential structure.

There is a classic comparison running through contemporary philosophy between Socrates and Christ, a judgement between them in human excellence. Socrates went to his death with calmness and poise. He accepted the judgement of the court, discoursed on the two alternatives suggested by death and on the dialectical indications of immortality; found no cause for fear, drank the poison and died.

Jesus - how much the contrary! Jesus was almost hysterical with terror and fear: looked for comfort from friends and escape from death, and found neither; finally got control of himself and accepted his death in silence and lonely isolation. I once thought this was because they each died a different sort of death. But now I think that this hypothesis, though correct, is secondary.

Now I believe that Jesus was a profoundly weaker man than Socrates. Socrates never wept over Athens; Socrates never expressed sorrow and pain at the betrayal of friends. Socrates was a philosopher; Jesus of Nazareth was a priest!

Extract from writing by Fr Andrew Hamilton sj -

For the Synod

We pray for the Church, that she may adopt listening and dialogue as a lifestyle at every level, and allow herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit towards the peripheries of the world.



Pope Francis asks for prayers for the Church during the month of the Synod. In doing so he reminds us that the Church is bigger than the Synod and that the Holy Spirit is bigger than the Church as we experience it. Those truths, of course, are what the Synod is designed to embody.

In his Intention Pope Francis brings us back to basics. In a recent talk he drew on the Gospel story where Jesus ticks off Peter for thinking as the world does and not as God does. Peter had tried to talk Jesus out of speaking pessimistically about being crucified. The Pope applied Jesus' words to Catholics who judged the health of the Church by the number of converts it made, by the size of its congregations and its numerical growth. He insisted that the Spirit is often to be found in the small things and people of life, and through working at the edges of the Church rather than at its centres. Just before the Synod Pope Francis underlined Christ's presence at the margins by visiting Morocco with its thousand or so Catholics spread throughout the whole nation. ...


