Thanks For The Memories

I arrived here at Toowong six years ago and, I dare say, with a little trepidation on both sides. I had had a drive through the Parish a week or so before to find out where the Churches were, because to be quite honest, I knew nothing about the place. I also was not sure what the reaction would be to the loss of the Jesuits but expected there would be a period of grieving and adjusting to the new reality. From the parishioners' point of view, apart from adjusting to a new priest (and this one not a Jesuit), there was some concern over the replacement of a community of priests with just one priest and what cut backs that might mean for the Parish.

From my own point of view, I was taken aback by the warmth of the welcome from the beginning, highlighted by that first concelebrated weekend of Masses, and the readiness of people to step into a role if it became vacant. I think there was an audible sigh of relief from the Parish when it became obvious I was not going to try to 'de-Jesuify' the Parish but was willing to work to maintain and even strengthen the traditions that gave each of the communities their unique identities.

So we had two years to get to know each other as life carried on pretty much as usual. I was grateful for the presence and support of Marwan during those years as he balanced his study and commitments at QUT, without holding back on his generous support of the Parish through his Sacramental Ministry.

And then the world changed very suddenly, with the onset of COVID 19. We had never seen anything like it before and we needed to be creative, rather than reactive to what was happening.

I have strong memories of celebrating the Easter ceremonies with just Marwan, some over in the Chapel at Manresa and some on the verandah of the Church with just the two of us around the Easter fire! But we survived! Many of us missed the gathering of the community, so we tried to stay in touch by filming a couple of special Feast Days and making them available for download, and then broadcasting a homily from me each week. Thanks to all those who helped not just to envisage what might be possible but also pieced together those broadcasts, especially Allison King and Kerry Rush who oversaw the productions and to Anthony Young who provided the music with a number of his choir. Then, a very generous parishioner donated the Livestreaming equipment so that we could not only participate in that year's Christmas celebrations but would change our outreach for ever. Not only those who can access our Sunday 5pm Mass remotely, but many relatives who were able to witness weddings and funerals and the like from far away are eternally grateful for your gift.

COVID undoubtedly has shown us new ways that we can be Church, but it wouldn't have if we didn't have a community that was resourceful, understanding, tolerant and willing to change. I know it has affected all of us in some way, but I would particularly like to single out those who had to change the way they received the Eucharistic elements. That can hit to the very core of our spirituality, but your willingness to find creative ways to share the Eucharist and the willingness of the whole community to be respectful of distance has played no small part in the fact that we have not had a major outbreak among our community, despite the regularity and closeness of our contact.

I leave this community with many treasured memories, both with the Church and the School communities. It has been great to have created a situation where the primary school children can easily attend a weekday Mass as well as an occasional weekend Mass shared with the Parish and, hopefully, before long, our Secondary school students will be able to resume those vibrant Eucharists we shared once a term before COVID.

Thanks so much to all of you for a treasure trove of such rich memories and particularly to the staff of Monica and Allison and the many volunteers who shared the ministry of the Parish over the past six years. I am indebted to you all.


