

# Passing of the radition

Fr Mark:

For over 129 years, a Church has been sited at Toowong, originally within the Parish of Rosalie.

From 1916, it was handed over to the care of the Jesuit Fathers with its first Parish Priest, Fr Richard Murphy S.J.. Since then over 50 priests have served this parish, 20 in the role of Parish Priest. In that time, the parish has developed and grown. Indooroopilly was formed as an independent Parish in 1926 and St Lucia followed in 1946.

Today we recognize that your Parish is transitioning not just in personnel, but also in structure and so, as a symbol of that transition, Fr Wrex, as the retiring 20th Parish Priest of Toowong, hands over the stoles representing the Church communities of St Ignatius and Holy Spirit to Fr Frank Brennan, who represents the community of Jesuits taking responsibility for the presbyteral ministry in the area.
