# Easter 03 - Peace As a Gift From God

Peace cannot be bought or sold: it is a gift of God. And we must ask for it.

The disciples are continually amazed at what Jesus does and says. He stands amongst them as the risen Lord, eating fish and talking with them. But their initial reaction is one of alarm, they were terrified; they were afraid of joy. They preferred to think of Jesus as a ghost rather than a reality. Jesus' whole task in the resurrection appearances is to help them understand this new reality. We tell ourselves that "it is better to think, yes, God exists, but he is out there, Jesus is risen, but he is out there!" We keep our distance from this new reality of joy welling within us. It will overcome us if we let it. Brene Brown teaches us that if we dull this feeling, in fact if we dull any of our feelings, we dull them all – we cannot be selective!

If we stay afraid of this joy then we will never enter into it. This amazement is not a sign of mental illness, of fantasy, but eventually of joy and they need to enter into that joy! This is not the same as the enthusiasm we have for our football team or at a concert, but is something much deeper.

That amazement is the beginning of the Christian life in Jesus. Pope Francis calls this "a mark to be made on the heart and beings spiritual consolation". We cannot always live in these feelings, but they do change our life irrevocably. +Francis goes on to say that "the ultimate degree of consolation is peace: we begin with amazement, then the quieter tone of this amazement, and from this consolation comes peace." Even in the most painful trials, the Christian never loses the peace and presence of Jesus. This is evidenced in all Christian martyrdom – look at any of their experiences and you will find peace at the heart of their conviction that Jesus is with them with courage and peace to endure whatever is their suffering. But that peace cannot be bought or sold; it is not ours. It is God's gift that we must ask for.

Unfortunately, there is no alternative option for 8 am Sunday Mass for the duration of the roof work on Holy Spirit Church.
